Minutes of the Great Milton Parish Council meeting held at The Pavilion on Monday, 20th November 2023 at 7:30 pm. Present: Cllrs S Harrod (Chair), B Fox (Vice-chair), D Harms, M Horsley, S MacMahon, Cllr Illingworth and Cllr G Heritage (SODC) In Attendance: Chris Ashworth (Clerk) and 3 members of the public.

122/23 Apologies for absence

Apologies were received from Cllr P Allen and Cllr F Van Mierlo (OCC)

123/23 Variation of order of business

Item 131/23 was spoken about after 136/23.

124/23 Declarations of members' interest

No declarations of members' interests were made.

125/23 Matters to report

The County Councillor and District Councillor's reports were received, reviewed, and are available on the Parish Council website.

Cllr G Heritage explained that her monthly report is mainly about available grants. Cllr G Heritage also told the Parish Council that some recent motions had been passed, including the real living wage with those who seek Council contracts, which ensures that all contractors are paid the living wage.

There was a special Council meeting to approve the Chinnor Neighbourhood Plan. Cllr G Heritage told Councillors about a recent email regarding the Joint Local Plan and reminded Councillors that consultation for the plan will be open in January 2024.

Cllr Harms raised the Waterstock refusal, to which Cllr Harrod asked if it's likely that the plans may be tried again. Cllr G Heritage explained that she can't answer for definite as she has no more information.

126/23 Correspondence and public discussion

P23/S2902/FUL (Milton Pools Fishery near Milton Common OX44 7JE) Retention of single-storey extension and its use for storage. (As amended by the agent's letter dated 24 October 2023).

P23/S2905/FUL (Milton Pools Fishery near Milton Common OX44 7JE) Continued use of the single-storey building as storage without compliance with condition 3 of P02/N0682. (As amended by agents letter dated 24 October 2023).

P23/S2906/FUL (Milton Pools Fishery near Milton Common OX44 7JE) The retention of the existing building and continued use as offices (mail order company). (As amended by agents letter dated 24 October 2023).

P23/S2907/FUL (Milton Pools Fishery near Milton Common OX44 7JE) Retention of single-storey building and continued use as two office units. (As amended by agents letter dated 24 October 2023).

P23/S3147/HH (The Penn Thame Road Great Milton OX44 7HX) Extension and conversion of roof to create habitable room within roof void. (Amended plans submitted 17 October 2023 to show the rear balcony removed and replaced with a Juliette balcony)

South Oxfordshire District Council hereby gives notice that planning permission is REFUSED.

C P23/S3035/FUL (The Bull The Green Great Milton OX44 7NS) Demolition of twentieth-century extensions. This planning application has been WITHDRAWN. Cllr Harrod explained that this has no effect on the other planning proposals and that application PS23/S3035/FUL is superfluous and was withdrawn at the request

of the Council.

131/23 Security in the village

Residents are encouraged to continue to report any incidents they witness or experience to the police via the 101 telephone service or online via the police.co.uk website. Neighbourhood Watch updated the Parish Council that there was one breakin incident during October, and all residents are reminded to ensure their homes are secure. The use of Medical message in a bottle were spoken about, and their usefulness. For more information, please see Message in a Bottle – Lions Clubs International or contact your local GP or local pharmacy. It was agreed an ad will be run in the Bulletin to promote the use of the medical message in a bottle.

132/23 Grass cutting in the Village

This is an ongoing issue with the quality of grass cutting completed by McCracken

within the Village. The Parish Clerk has recently managed to speak to Steve McCracken (owner of McCracken & sons) and raised the recent issues. McCracken should complete the last cut of the year soon, and the Parish Council will seek a new contractor for the following year's growing season. The contract will be allowed to end at the end of February, and a new contractor will be found.

133/23 Internet connection in the Cabin for the Great Milton History Society

Great Milton History Society has asked if the Parish Council would consider funding the cost of getting the new premises connected via a dongle. The cost would be £19.00 per month. All councillors agree that the Parish Council will cover the cost, which will be included in the yearly budget.

134/23 Planning letter for the Village

To review a planning letter for newly approved applications in the Village, which will be sent to all newly approved applications, reminding people of the impact on the Village and to be mindful. A few changes were agreed upon, which will be implemented in the draft letter.

135/23 The Well on The Green Steps

The restoration of The Well on the Green has been completed, and it has been noted that the original stone steps require attention. It was agreed that the steps do need to be repaired. As finding a stonemason can sometimes be lengthy, it was agreed that the Parish Clerk would get a tidy-up of the steps completed and then reassess the situation.

136/23 First draft of Budget 2024-25

To consider the first draft of the Parish Council's budget for 2024-25. The Parish Councillors reviewed the first draft of the budget with a few areas raised by Cllr Fox. The areas raised were whether the Clerk's salary was sufficient due to the impending change of Clerk. It was agreed that, at this time, the current level was suitable. Cllr Fox also raised that the Christmas Tree purchase should be added to the budget.

Cllr Fox asked the Parish Clerk to complete a YTD spend before the next Parish Council meeting, and it was agreed that the Clerk will ensure this will be done before the December Parish Council meeting.

The Parish Councillors discussed the current agreement that the Parish Council pay the insurance for the Recreation ground and make a £400 yearly grant. It was agreed that the Parish Council would continue to pay these but agreed that the £400 grant will be issued once an AGM report has been received as part of the Parish Council's APM, which is held each April.

The following Great Milton Parish Council meeting will be held on Monday, 11th December 2023, at 7.30 pm at the Pavilion.

St Mary's Church Great Milton Thursday December 7th 6.00pm to 7.00pm.

Come for quiet reflection and the chance to meditate on the 23rd Psalm, in both word word and music, as we think of ongoing conflicts, particularly in Gaza and Israel.

The Rector's Pint

On the days immediately following Christmas Day there are three further holy days; St Stephen on the 26th, St John on the 27th and on the 28th, the Commemoration of the Slaughtered Innocents. This is a deeply unpleasant story. Following the birth of Jesus, Joseph was warned in a dream to flee, with Mary and the baby, to Egypt. Herod had heard of Jesus' birth, thanks to the very 'unwise' men who had told him of the birth of a new king, and he planned to hunt Jesus down and kill him. To do this, he ordered that all the male children in and around Bethlehem, who were two years old or under, should be killed. The story is found in the second chapter of Matthew's gospel.

Bethlehem was not a large town; we would think of it as a village, and was probably home to no more than twenty or thirty babies and infants. The incident is not recorded anywhere else, but in a land where brutality was widespread, the murder of twenty or so children in an un-important town would scarcely have caused a stir. It is no less terrible for that, and we do know from independent accounts that this is precisely the sort of thing Herod would have done. There is a long list of atrocities associated with him, including the killing of his wife and three sons.

We are all horribly aware of another terrible 'slaughter of innocents', with the shocking and brutal atrocity committed by Hamas in Israel two months ago, and the consequences which followed in Gaza, when so many children were caught up in the conflict. I believe that we should grieve for the suffering and deaths of all these innocents, without prejudice. I am not going to try to unravel a horribly complex situation here. The truth is, the fallout has been terrible. Innocents have been slaughtered.

The Biblical story of the slaughter of the innocents, hidden away at the back of our Christmas celebrations, is a reminder that Jesus, whom Christians call 'Immanuel, God with us,' was born into a world in which acts of brutality were commonplace.

In the carol, 'It Came Upon the Midnight Clear,' are these words: Yet, with the woes of sin and strife, the world has suffered long; Beneath the angels' strain have rolled two thousand years of wrong; And man, at war with man hears not the love-song which they bring. Oh, hush the noise, ye men of strife, and hear the Angels sing. The

story of the slaughtered innocents is a reality check amidst the festive sentiment and excess, but year by year we can still declare this love song, this message of Immanuel. In these uncertain and troubled times, I hope that all those of you who read 'The Pint' will know the blessing of the Christ child, 'God with us' this Christmas.

I won't list the stories of the moment as they may well have changed completely by the time you read this. You may find the news a very difficult watch and choose to avoid it if you can. If only the news could be a little more ordinary or perhaps extraordinary, but in a good way.

We live in a culture that loves everything to be at least a little bit special. Advertisers never tire of telling me how their products will make me or my life so much more special. And at Christmas everything has to be even more special. Life will be magical and extraordinary beyond words with an M&S, John Lewis or ASDA Christmas. The adverts are often truly amazing.

It's not just the adverts that get the Christmas treatment – are you looking forward to the Strictly Come Dancing Christmas Special? No? Me neither. But you know your favourite TV programme has made it if it gets a Christmas Special!

View from Views

It's been a little wet of late! we have more water standing on our fields than I can remember, don't quite understand why. This I think it must be that, although we have not had much more rain than other years, but it has kept raining a little. Most crops now seem to be suffering from this continual wet, what I don't know



is how much more they will stand. The wheat I told you about last month that we planted into a standing cover crop of some 18" tall, is through the ground and looking promising and, I hasten to add this is the one crop that does not seem to be suffering, it is on much drier ground. Oil Seed Rape (OSR) I fear a right off. On reflection the slug problem in the OSR may be caused by the fact that, by trying to be green we did not move the ground prior to planting, this gave the slugs a wonderful climate to breed. Lots of trash from the previous crop, plus lumps of straw left by the baler. I think this illustrates that all the great benefits of leaving everything to nature does not necessarily work under all conditions, some of the rewilding, nature friendly farming, are not always the answer, or practical, a learning curve. The jury is out nothing is plain sailing in spite of all the environmental pressure by those who do not have to pay the bill and sit in an armchair pontificating.

Periodically we are visited by a pair of Collared Doves, these birds pair up for life, over the last month or so there have only been one, I ask the question why? the survivor does look a little down hearted. Then one day, only on one occasion, there were 3 or 4all arguing amongst themselves, now back to only one again, so we can only speculate on his/her future/demise. Most migrating birds have now left us, including the Swifts and Swallows who I thought a little late this year, we now wait for our winter visitors to return. There are some good flocks starlings, which is heartening as they are supposed to on the decline, and many large flocks of small birds mainly tits I am informed, would really like to know what they are, I do believe that these flocks contain many different species, I would like to think these include Linnets, as I keep being asked, have you got any Linnets, to which I have to answer I haven't a clue. The great news is that we now have barns Owls in 2 parts of the farm, one seen near the village and, the other by Cuddesdon Mill, (as seen on the front of Stahampton's Village Voice). All these being accompanied an explosion in the Partridge population, also loads of Sky Larks all over the farm. It is very gratifying to us to think that some of the conservation measures we have taken could be having an effect. To add to this Hares are once again on the increase as are the Deer.

We are led to believe that our District Council, I have no reason to doubt this, is

one of the best at recycling our waste. They have a very simple system and, it is a pity the rest of the country does not do the same. It to me is ridiculous that all councils don't use the same-coloured bins for the same uses. Here in South Oxfordshire, we are told that all the green bins are sorted and recycled, and the grey bins take all nonrecyclable waste which go to be incinerated, (not ideal but at least it does generate electricity). Recently the bin men left a sticker on the lid of our Green Bins stating, use this QR code to understand what can and cannot be recycled, this is all very well and good but, not all understand a QR code, I cannot see what is wrong with a simple piece of paper that can be filed, or in our case on the kitchen notice board, for easy reference. Anything as important as this must be a simple as possible for everyone to understand.

Great news for the time being, as many by now will have heard Waterstock Golf Course has been turned down, I guess it will only be time before it is revived again, and we will have to go through the whole process again. This application was accompanied by all sorts great works that the developers were going to include as a sop for to us locals to make it look good and gender our support, like a forest school 150 sqm about the area of the penalty area of a football pitch, a creche 600 sqm not much bigger about ½ a football pitch, 120,000sqm of amenity buildings, who are they trying to impress. This just shows how developers try and show they are mitigating the impact on the area, in giving something to the community.

Recently the Aerobic digester at Cassington was hit by lightning, we learnt that this was owned by a Water Company, why does a water company own a recycling plant, nothing to do with water supply, or sewage treatment, and now we the taxpayer have to pick up the bill to make improvements to the existing infrastructure, doesn't seem right to me.

Finally I wish all readers a happy Christmas and more importantly a peaceful New Year! *Charles Peers*

We were treated to a conversation with Sir Tim Rice; Charlie Lee Potter using her charm and skill to interview our famous, former resident.


