Minutes of the Great Milton Parish Council meeting held at The Pavilion on Monday, 11th December 2023 at 7:30 pm. Present: Cllrs S Harrod (chair), P Allen, D Harms, M Horsley, S MacMahon and Cllr G Heritage (SODC). In attendance: Chris Ashworth (Clerk) and 2 members of the public.

#### 137/23 Apologies for absence

#### 138/23 Variation of order of business

There was no variation in the order of business.

#### 139/23 Declarations of members' interest

#### 140/23 Matters to report

The District Councillors' report was received and reviewed and is available on the Parish Council website.

Cllr Heritage (SODC) updated the Councillors on her report, with lots of work on the Neighbourhood Plans. With Neighbourhood plan referendums held for Lewknor, Towersey and Wheatley.

Cllr Heritage visited the Cornwell Solar Farm site near Stoke Talmage, and this site is run by the same company that will be installing the Harlesford solar farm. This visit helped to open up links between Cllr Heritage and the Company – Low Carbon Ltd.

The Warm Spaces initiative is running in South Oxfordshire. The South Oxfordshire centres are Abbey Sports Centre (Berinsfield), Didcot Wave (Didcot), Henley Leisure Centre (Henley), Park Sports Centre (Wheatley) and Thame Leisure Centre (Thame).

The Warm Spaces scheme will run from 9 am-2 pm on weekdays in the café and communal areas of the centres. All the centres have been registered on the official Warm Spaces website.

#### 143/23 Minutes of the previous meeting

The minutes of the November meeting of the Parish Council, held on Monday, 20th November 2023, were received, reviewed, agreed and signed as a true and accurate record of proceedings.

B The monthly bank reconciliation, accounts and bank statement for November were received, reviewed and approved.

C Budget 2024-25

The second draft of the budget was reviewed. Since the draft budget was discussed at the November Parish Council meeting, the forecast number of households in the village paying council tax in 2024-25 has been received. This forecast shows that the number will rise by 3.7%. With increased costs, the Parish Clerk is proposing that the Parish Council increase the precept by a total of 7%. This comprises a 3.7% increase in the number of households paying Council Tax and a 3.3% increase by the Parish Council.

Cllr Harrod recommended to the Parish Council that the Precept be increased more than proposed on the second draft budget to allow for additional expenditure, including helping to fund the local Freecycle scheme, which was not included in the second budget draft. Cllr Harrod told the other Councillors that the Parish component of the Council tax is so small that even a 10% increase in the precept is less than a 1% increase in Council tax. All the Parish Councillors present agreed with Cllr Harrod, and the Parish Clerk will draft a new budget with these changes.

Precept 2024-25

The proposed Precept from the second budget draft was not approved, with changes to be made to the request.

#### 145/23 Parish clerk and councillors' update of matters in hand

- Christmas tree recycling will be located adjacent to the entrance to the Rec. Trees
  must be 6ft or under or cut down to size and left by 9th January for collection on
  10th January.
- Carol singing around the Christmas tree will be held on Wednesday 13th December at 6 pm with mulled wine and mince pies at The Bull afterwards.

#### 146/23 Security in the village

The Neighbourhood Watch representative attended the meeting. With discussion about the progress of the Lion's message in a bottle scheme. Which has around 30 residents now taking part. Residents are encouraged to continue to report any incidents they witness or experience to the police via the 101 telephone service or online via the police.co.uk website.

#### 147/23 Steps to the Well on the Green

Green and Growing have been out and completed the tidy-up to the steps to the green and have given the Parish Council estimated quotes for potential work to the steps. The Parish Council all agreed in favour of getting Green and Growing to complete the works and that the works should be done to fully repair the steps. The Parish Clerk will arrange with the above contractor to get these works completed.

#### 148/23 Neighbourhood planning update

Cllrs Harms, updated the Councillors on the Neighbourhood planning online presentation.

Cllr Harms reported back that the online presentation was very interesting. Cllr Harms raised the biodiversity and climate side of the Neighbourhood plan as being the most critical area for small Villages. Although this is important, Cllr Harms also pointed out that to complete a Neighbourhood Plan, you need a lot of time, money and resources, as well as the expertise of someone who understands the area to help complete a successful plan. Cllr Harrod raised the point that Great Milton is too

small of a Village, with not enough developmental land to worry about the expensive undertaking of a Neighbourhood Plan. Cllr Harrod pointed out that a Parish Plan was completed in 2012 with very little coming from this plan and took a lot of time, money and resources to complete.

#### The Rector's Pint

For my piece this month, I mainly want to offer a brief tribute to my predecessor in these parishes, Rev. Victor Story.

Victor was the Rector here for fifteen years, more than enough time to get his feet under the table! I only met him a few times, when he returned here to assist with funerals, to give the eulogy or lead the prayers for people he had known well. I was always impressed by his attention to detail, and his warmth and love for those he was remembering.

Victor was a gentle man, and I know that he was a man of prayer. As a qualified teacher, he maintained a love for the schools, and I know that he was also well loved by them. His funeral took place on 14th December at St. Mary's and it was well attended by many of his friends from the various parishes he had served in.

Victor had no family of his own. He was married for a few years in the 1990's, a time that brought him great joy. Tragically, his wife died, and I know that Victor carried the grief of that for the rest of his life.

Of course there was sadness at his funeral, but there was also much joy and thanksgiving, as we heard about his ministry here and elsewhere, including his life in Chipping Norton following his retirement, and what he meant to Matilda, the granddaughter of Vera who used to clean the Rectory. Victor had appointed Matilda as his executor without her knowledge, but she did a magnificent job of pulling the funeral together. My thanks to Tim Suter and Kate Billimore and the choir for organising the music in such a short time - with Carol Services looming only three days later. The Nunc Dimittis at the end of the funeral was particularly beautiful. So many have commented that the whole service was 'just so Victor!'

It is hoped that Victor's ashes will be interred in the grave of beloved his wife in Evesham, where Victor served as curate between 1981 and 1985.

I would also like to send my best wishes for the New Year to all readers of the 'Pint'. We have all experienced a bumpy ride for several years now, and we can only look out with increased sadness at the news we see unfolding in parts of our world. It adds some urgency to the beginning of the Lord's prayer every time we use it: 'Thy kingdom come, thy will be done....' In our own small way though, each of us has a responsibility to be an answer to that prayer.

As St Paul wrote in his letter to the Hebrews: (Chapter 11 Verse 1)

"Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen".

Through faith, we have hope. Peace and blessing to you all for 2024.

#### **Info Point**

#### A New Way of Exploring St Mary's Church

Anyone recently visiting St Mary's will have had access to an excellent guide book or leaflet but now there will be an additional way of gaining information about our own historic building which is both complementary and innovative. The church is now the first religious building in Oxfordshire to have an 'Info Point'. The latter generates an 'off-grid' web that users can connect to (using their own 'phones) via its own localised Wi-Fi network. Anyone with a devise containing a modern web browser can use Info Point' Wi-Fi hotspot to gain free access to an 11-point interactive tour of the church's unique features. It is all simpler than it sounds, the straightforward instructions are displayed inside the north door (as you know, the latter is usually open during daylight hours). There are lots of photographs (even a picture jigsaw if you have time!) and it is possible to stop and start at any stage. You may be surprised what you might find out for the first time. It is also expected to be a valuable aid for the many overseas visitors who call in while staying at Le Manoir.

The church tour is only the first piece of information to be featured. Extra details on the Dormer monument and the musical instruments have already added but one of its advantages, over printed material, is that future changes can be recorded. It has been installed in advance of the imminent restoration of the monument. A video of the conservation work is to be included. This project has been funded in association with the latter work by several grant bodies (details of which will be publicised later). Plans to add a children's quiz is just one of the ideas in process.

So, bring your 'phone to church (if it is not used during the service!). Anyone keen to know more about Info Point (or, indeed getting involved in adding new content – a valuable student exercise?) are encouraged to contact Fred Cubbage 07484 851616. The church is indebted to Andrew Meynell who allowed his guide 'St Mary's and Great Milton' to be used as a source for much of the tour content and Nick Belcher for some of the photos.






